Approved Leadership Activities

The following list of approved leadership activities for LEA 491 represents a *sample* of the various types of leadership activities in which students may engage. Students may participate in these leadership activities or may select activities not listed herein through consultation with their faculty advisor.

Below is a list of typical leadership activities in six different categories highlighted in the Artios curriculum. Students who choose to focus on an area of leadership not included herein may develop a list of approved leadership activities in consultation with their faculty advisor.

Church Leadership/Administration

- Attendance and participation in church board meetings.
- Leadership of various church-wide events, initiatives, projects, etc.
- Duties associated with an office of the church (e.g. treasurer, secretary).
- Teaching or training others in church leadership.

Family/Group Ministries

- Ministry to families OR demographic groups (e.g. children, youth, young adults, adults, senior adults, married couples, singles)
- Vacation Bible School
- Youth Groups
- Young Adult Groups
- Men's/Women's groups
- Teaching or training others in family/group ministry.

Outreach Ministry

- Leading or participating in outreach or evangelistic events, initiatives, or programs.
- Personally sharing your faith in Christ with non-Christians.
- Teaching or training others in outreach and evangelism.
- Serving non-believers in your city, area, nation, or world with the love of Christ.

Worship Ministry

- Leading or participating in a worship team during services.
- Worship team rehearsals and meetings.

- Teaching or training others in worship arts.

Christian Education/Discipleship/Spiritual Formation Ministries

- Administration of Sabbath School, small groups or other Christian education or discipleship ministries.
- Teaching Sabbath School.
- Leading a small group or engaging in one-on-one discipleship, mentorship or coaching.
- Teaching or training others in Christian education or discipleship.

Guidance Ministries

- Providing spiritual counsel to individuals facing grief, loss, major decisions, or otherwise in need of “soul care”.
- Leading small groups specifically designed for support or recovery.
- Teaching or training others in providing spiritual guidance.

Other

Students who choose to focus on an area of leadership not included above may develop a list of approved ministry activities in consultation with their faculty advisor.
